



Capps Coach House, Kentucky

Coach House Hot Brown

For each portion cut the crust from a slice of white bread that has been well toasted, cut diagonally and place on plate end to end. Cover toast with either chicken or turkey sliced very thin. Cover this with your favorite medium cream sauce, sprinkle with sliced fresh mushrooms and Parmesan cheese and a dash of paprika. Edge the cream sauce with four cubes of fresh tomato. Place under broiler until cream sauce starts to bubble then remove and cross plate with partly cooked bacon. Return to

the broiler until plate is very hot. Garnish with a sprig of parsley. This is a wonderful way to make a party dish of left-over holiday fowl.

Fried Camembert Cheese

Cut Camembert cheese in desired portions, after removing rind. Dip in beaten eggs and fresh bread crumbs. Harden in refrigerator. Before serving fry very quickly in hot, deep grease. Currant jelly or Bar-le-Duc and melba toast may be served with it.

Oyster Brochette Montebello

Wrap six raw oyster and six fresh mushroom heads separately in bacon and alternate on skewers. Dip in mixture of one cup oil, one

teaspoon salt, one teaspoon English mustard and pinch of pepper. Roll in crumbs and fry in butter 25 minutes. Serve with lemon butter.

Paul Zeibig combines the jobs of owner and chef well at this hotel, to which gourmets flock for his delicacies. It's a pleasant drive from San Francisco on State Highway 21 in Danville. Open for lunch and dinner every day except Mondays.
